WATER RESOURCES

Objective: Water quality of streams in Lewis and Clark County are adequate to meet their intended use.

Goal: Work with local landowners on an as-needed basis on water quality and quantity issues.

Action Item 1: Develop strategy for working with landowners within the watershed of the priority stream segment and gain landowner support for completion of stream assessment.

**Lake Helena Watershed (Prickly Pear, Ten Mile and Silver Creeks)—Ongoing
WQPD/LCCD/JVCD
Dearborn—Ongoing/LCCD & NRCS
Blackfoot River—Ongoing with Blackfoot Ch.
Elk Creek/Sun River—Complete
Missouri River—ongoing with MRCDC**

Action Item 2: With landowners, begin to develop management alternatives, identify management incentives and cost share opportunities. Complete management plans and implementation schedules; begin implementation.

**Watershed groups where there is landowner support; individual work with landowners where there is not enough support for a watershed group.
Stabilize Elk Creek & Willow Creek to reduce erosion and sediment load.**

Action Item 3: Lewis & Clark Conservation District works with landowners on TMDL issues.

Ongoing work with other partner agencies. Dates will be re-assessed as necessary.

PLANT RESOURCES

Objective: Lewis & Clark Conservation District assists other weed management activities in the control and reduction of noxious weeds.

Goal: Develop and implement an education plan for noxious weed identification, awareness, and control.

Action Item 1: Continue working with county, state and federal agencies to share weed information, mapping and planning strategies to maintain the collaborative approach.

Action Item 5: Initiation of weed reward program. Weeds will be orange hawkweed, purple loosestrife and yellow star thistle. At the January 2006 Board Meeting, the Board of Supervisors decided to implement an incentive program in the District. The Board will pay the finder a \$50 reward, with a total maximum limit paid out per year of \$1000. To receive this reward, weed finders have to have their "find" verified by the County Weed District who will then inform the Conservation District that the finder is eligible to be paid.

Objective: Landowners in Lewis & Clark County manage their grazing lands in a sustainable manner.

Goal 1: 200000 acres of well-managed grazing land exist in Lewis & Clark Conservation District by 2005 dependent upon climatic conditions.

Action Item 1: Landowners along the impaired stream segments are encouraged to develop grazing management plans when stream assessments indicates that water quality is being impacted by domestic livestock grazing.

Action Item 2: Annually conduct grazing land tours and workshops, which feature practical applications to management challenges and problems.

Action Item 3: NRCS and others report to the Lewis & Clark Conservation District regarding on-going grazing management assistance provided to

landowners. This item pertains to individual units unrelated to group planning activities.

Action Item 4: Resource data, which characterize Lewis & Clark Conservation District grazing lands, are kept current and up to date. These databases are on a county and/or watershed scale.

Action Item 5: Coordinate with Farm Services Agency County Committee for Drought Planning for 2006.

PEOPLE RESOURCE

Objective: Maintain quality customer service in Lewis & Clark County.

Goal: Provide conservation education opportunities targeting issues in Lewis & Clark County.

Action Item 1: Organizes the Land Stewardship Series on an as needed basis. Work with County Extension as well as other agencies to present timely conservation topics for large and small acreage landowners.

Action Item 2: Annually sponsors or co-sponsors with the county weed board a weed workshop for landowners, which includes identification and control strategies.

Action Item 3: Educators in Lewis & Clark County are aware of the Youth Education curriculums available from the Conservation District.

Action Item 4: District administrator coordinates and maintains a quality newsletter as one form of learning media for Lewis and Clark County residents.

Action Item 5: Outreach that addresses weed identification and control.

Action Item 1: A strategy is developed which will enable the District to inform and educate Lewis & Clark legislators regarding conservation districts, natural resource issues and challenges.






